



STAIN REMOVAL

Stain	
Alcoholic drinks / wines	<ul> <li>Dab with absorbent napkin</li> <li>Remove the stain with a carpet shampoo solution</li> <li>Moisten the carpet with clean water</li> </ul>
Blood	<ul> <li>Take up with absorbent napkin</li> <li>Immediately dab with cold water</li> <li>Use a carpet shampoo solution</li> <li>Finally, moisten the carpet with clean water</li> </ul>
Butter / oil / grease	<ul> <li>Scrape with a knife.</li> <li>Dot the stain with a cloth impregnated with stain remover for grease stains</li> <li>Use a carpet cleaner</li> <li>Wash with clean water</li> </ul>
Stearin	<ul> <li>As far as possible, remove solidified stearin by gently scraping</li> <li>Lay tracing paper on the stain and use a hot iron</li> <li>Repeat this treatment (with clean tracing paper) until not longer stearin is absorbed</li> <li>For further treatment, use a stain remover for grease stains</li> </ul>
Wood glue	<ul><li>Remove most of the glue</li><li>Remove the remaining glue with warm water</li></ul>
Bubble gum	<ul> <li>Cool the chewing gum with lumps of ice in a plastic bag</li> <li>Divide the chewing gum into small pieces and remove the loose pieces a blunt edge of a knife</li> <li>Remove the residue with a chewing gum stain remover</li> </ul>
Chocolate / cocoa	<ul> <li>Dup with a little household alcohol</li> <li>Use a cloth with a carpet shampoo solution</li> <li>Moisten the area with clean water and brush with the pile</li> </ul>
Coffee / Coca-Cola / tea	<ul> <li>Remove the stain with a carpet shampoo solution</li> <li>Dab with a solution of 1 part vinegar and 10 parts water</li> <li>Moisten the area with clean water</li> </ul>
Dirty oil / tar	Use a cloth with a stain remover for grease stains
Fruit / fruit juice	<ul><li>Dab with cold water</li><li>Carpet shampoo solution</li><li>Diluted detergent</li><li>Moisten the area with water</li></ul>
Furniture wax / make up	Dab with a cloth with turpentine     Use a carpet shampoo solution
Glue	<ul><li>Remove as much glue as possible</li><li>Clean with acetone</li></ul>
Ink (Filler Pen)	<ul><li>Remove as much ink as possible with tracing paper</li><li>Dab with warm water and carpet shampoo solution</li></ul>
Ink (Ballpoint pen / felt pen)	Dup with household alcohol     Then with a carpet shampoo solution
Lipstick	<ul><li>Use a cloth with a stain remover for grease stains</li><li>Then use a carpet shampoo solution</li></ul>
Milk/egg	<ul> <li>Dab with a cloth of warm water and a biological detergent</li> <li>Use carpet shampoo solution</li> <li>Moisten the area with clean water</li> </ul>

Pletter	Midler
Mudd	<ul> <li>Let the mud dry</li> <li>Vacuum lightly</li> <li>If necessary, use carpet shampoo solution</li> <li>Moisten the area with clean water</li> </ul>
Nail polish	<ul><li>Remove the stain with a nail polish remover (not oil based)</li><li>The stain then disappears without damaging the carpet</li></ul>
Paint	<ul> <li>Remove a fresh stain with turpentine (if it is paint on) oil-based or similar types) or with water (if any water-based paint or similar type)</li> <li>If the stain is dry, sand it off gently and carefully with a coarse grater sandpaper</li> <li>Use a carpet shampoo solution</li> <li>Moisten the area with cold water</li> </ul>
Rust	<ul> <li>Remove the stain with a rust remover (However, first try the remedy on one piece of the rug that is not so conspicuous, to ensure that the agent does not change the color of the rug</li> </ul>
Sugar and sugary products	<ul> <li>Immediate treatment is required. Dab the stain with napkins</li> <li>Moisten the area with cold water</li> <li>Remove debris with napkins while drying the rug</li> </ul>
Urin	<ul> <li>Immediate treatment is required</li> <li>Dab the stain with napkins</li> <li>Moisten the area with clean water</li> <li>Clean the carpet with carpet shampoo and a little deodorant</li> </ul>
